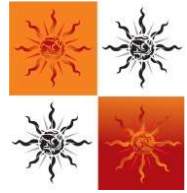

IN THE INTERIM

Dear Friends,

As I return from Ministry Days and General Assembly (the annual gathering of our Unitarian Universalist congregations), I am changed. I have a new trust and belief in our faith that is founded upon genuine transformation. We are *moving toward* the beloved community of racial equity and diversity that we have so long spoken about and have not realized. Before now. Until now.

GA evidenced this. Black people and other people of color were moved to the center of leadership and discussion. Ministers spent time together in restorative justice circles. We were led in our General Assembly by more black leaders than ever before including Revs. Sofia Betancourt and William Sinkford and Dr. Leon Spencer, interim co-presidents, Cheryl Walker, President of the Minister's Association, and Dr. Leon Burke III, GA Music Director. Most importantly, commitments were made to BLUU (Black Lives of UU) and people's stories of past and present were heard and deeply respected.

This kind of change is real and hopeful. We have a long way to go and we are doing things differently.

For the last few years, I thought that I was learning about racial equity, white supremacy and systemic racism. Now I know that it is about so much more than just learning; it is about transforming.

Bryan Stevenson, author of *Just Mercy* and keynote speaker at the Ware Lecture at General Assembly, talked with passion about the four things which he sees as essential for transformation toward a just world:

1. *Get proximate* – be in relationship to those who are poor, abused, and neglected. The answers to problems of justice come when we get proximate, he told us, not before.
2. *Change the narrative* – refuse to believe false narratives that perpetuate injustice. Question the beliefs and stories that we tell ourselves.
3. *Stay hopeful* – hope is the one thing that we cannot compromise.
4. *Be willing to do uncomfortable things* - for we will not change the world, or ourselves, until we do.

We can certainly aspire to live as Mr. Stevenson challenges us. These guidelines align with many great teachers: The Buddha, who left a privileged life and taught that none of us are free until all of us are free; Jesus of Nazareth, who welcomed prostitutes; Dorothy Day, who lived with the poor; and Bill Wilson, who found his salvation in working with low bottom alcoholics.

I'll be away from church for the month of July. Over that time and into August, I will be doing an 8-week practice of the spiritual exercises of Saint Ignatius, learning more of my family history through ancestry research, reading black authors, writing my own work, and loving – always loving – life, my family and friends, and each of you.

Have a blessed summer! May you find green pastures within which to rest, pathways to lead you to new understandings, and inspiration to carry you every day.

EXCITING OPPORTUNITY to HELP LEAD FPB through MULTICULTURAL / EQUITY TRANSFORMATION

Dear First Parish Congregation,

Our Parish Board voted in June to engage Dr. Darnisa Amante and Rev. Eric Jackson of DEEP (Disruptive Equity Education Project) to help our community work and learn together as we intensify our commitment next year to live into that part of our mission that calls for us to “celebrate multicultural community” and “work together to dismantle racism”. We will use DEEP’s “Equity Framework” (<https://digdeepforequity.com/our-approach/>), which helps organizations and their leaders in their equity work, equips organizations to analyze their institutional structures, and helps build an organization’s capacity to engage in a transformative process that leads to increased equity. A task force composed of representatives of the Board, Transition Team and Diversity Caucus and several “at-large” volunteers worked together over many months to study, research, interview and finally recommend DEEP.

Interested members of our congregation are now invited to consider serving on a “Core Leadership Team” to work with Dr. Amante and Rev. Jackson, during the coming church year and provide FPB-based leadership for our congregation-wide work on equity. This 15-18-member core leadership team will consist of members from the congregation, as well as representatives from the Parish Board, the Transition Team, and the Diversity Caucus.

A small planning team has been formed to recruit the larger leadership team, and to work out the preliminary schedule and project plan with Dr. Amante this summer. Our hope is to have our act together and an initial plan ready before September so we can hit the ground running. We will know more details about the Core Leadership Team’s full responsibilities after the planning team meets with Dr. Amante this summer, but members of the larger “Core Leadership Team” will most likely be counted on to:

- Work closely with Dr. Amante and Rev. Jackson, to learn and help implement the DEEP Equity Framework here at First Parish.
- Attend two workshops in September 2017, and if possible, participate in the four workshops that will be offered for the whole congregation during 2017-2018.
- Help co-facilitate small discussion groups during the workshop sessions, and/or following the workshops.
- Be available to congregation members as we undertake this learning together.
- Be committed to their own and others’ learning as we undertake this work of transformation.
