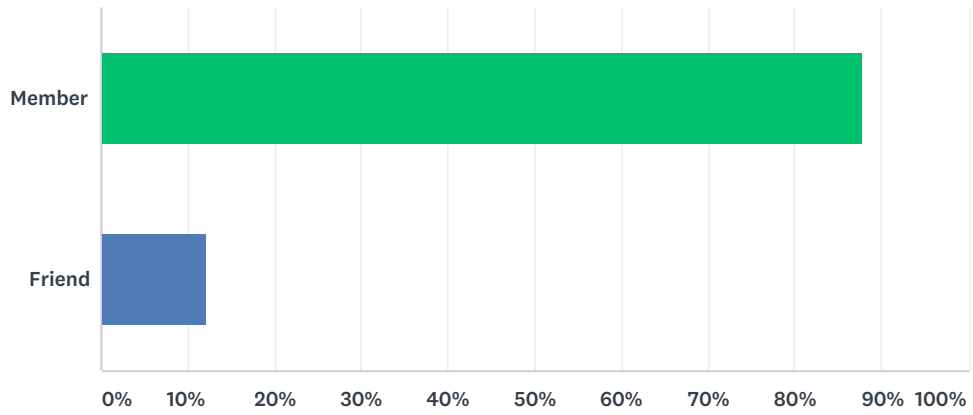

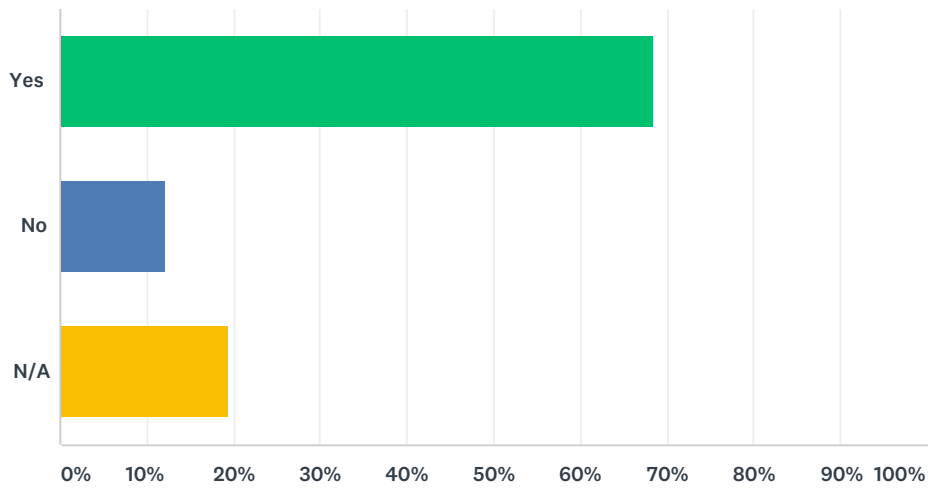

## Q2 If you have a spouse/partner, is your spouse/partner affiliated with the congregation?

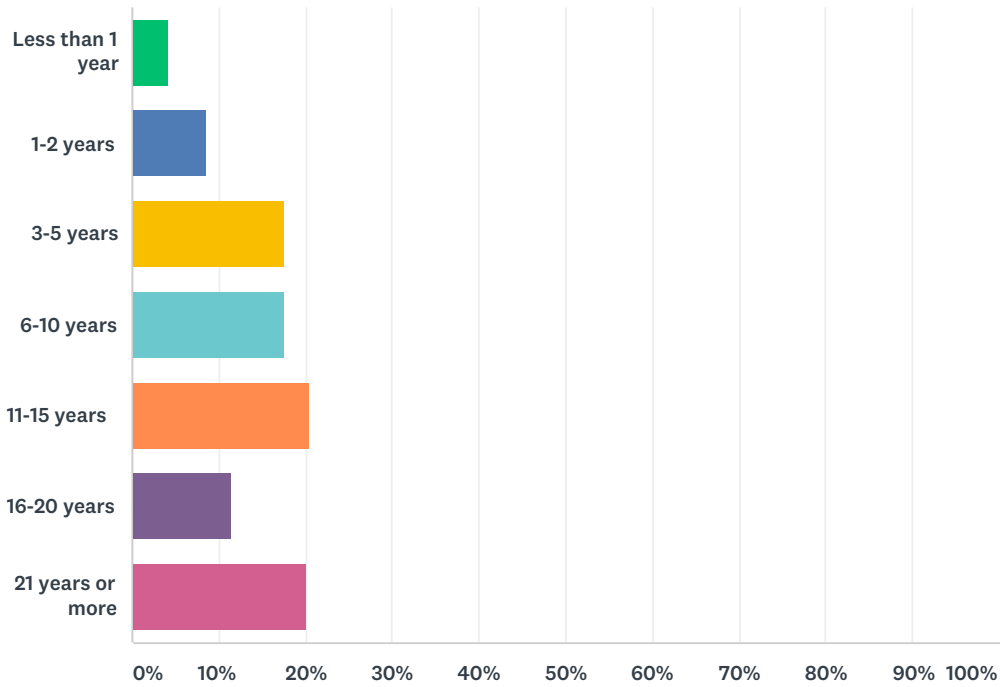

### Q3 How long have you been associated with First Parish in Brookline?

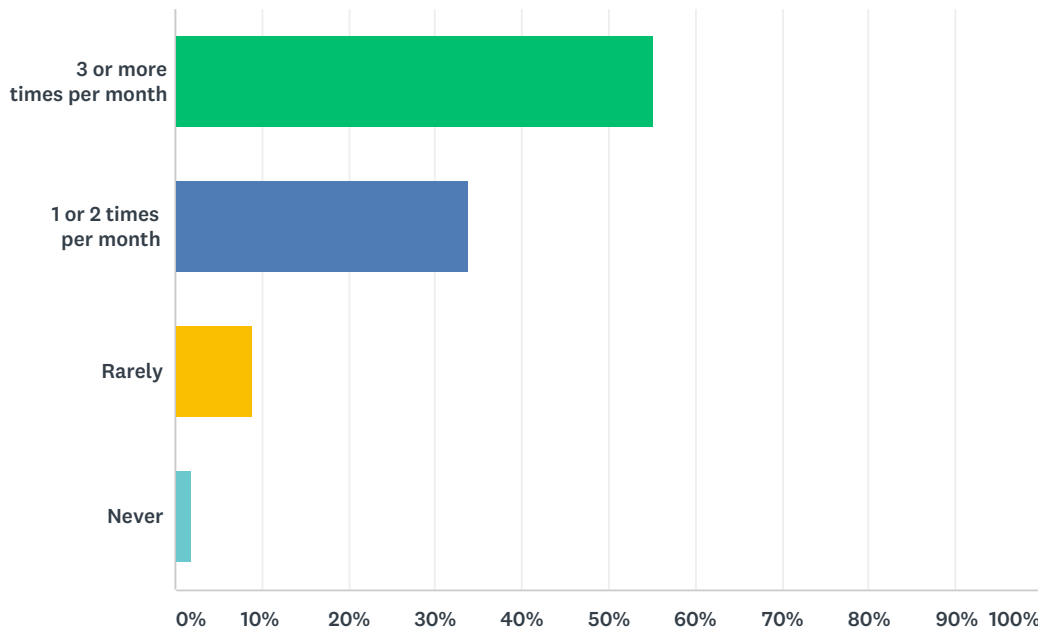

### Q4 During the last year church year, approximately how often have you been present at First Parish in Brookline on Sunday morning?

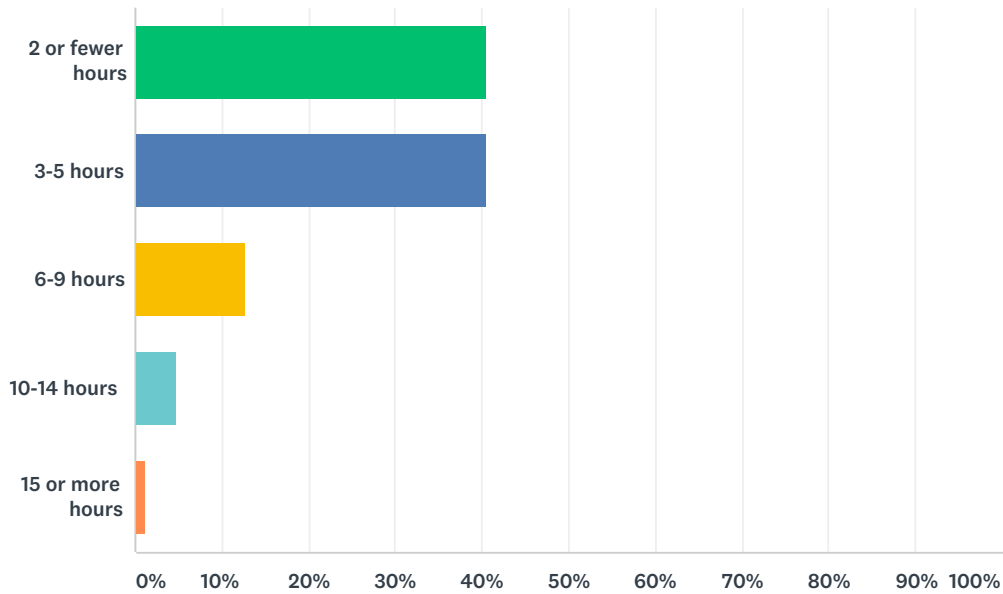

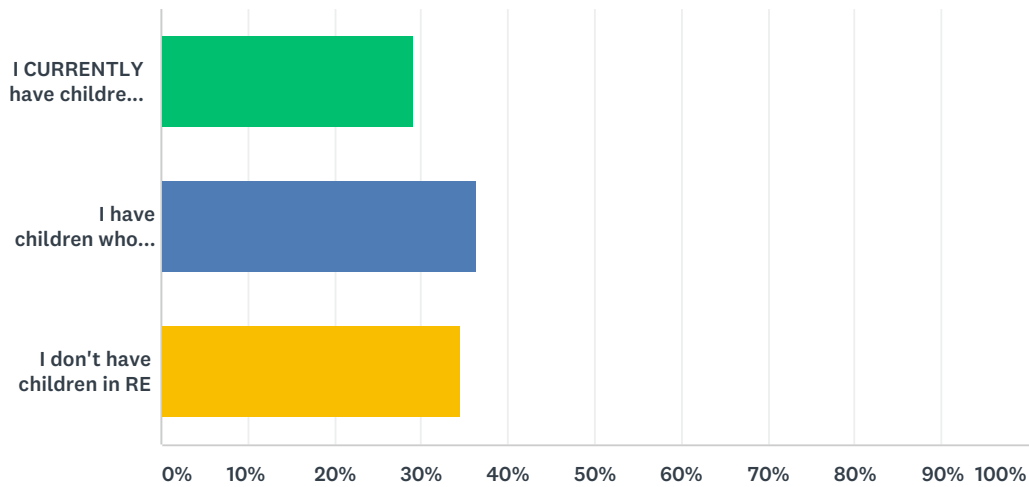

## Q6 Which of the following best describes your relationship with the Religious Education Program at First Parish in Brookline?

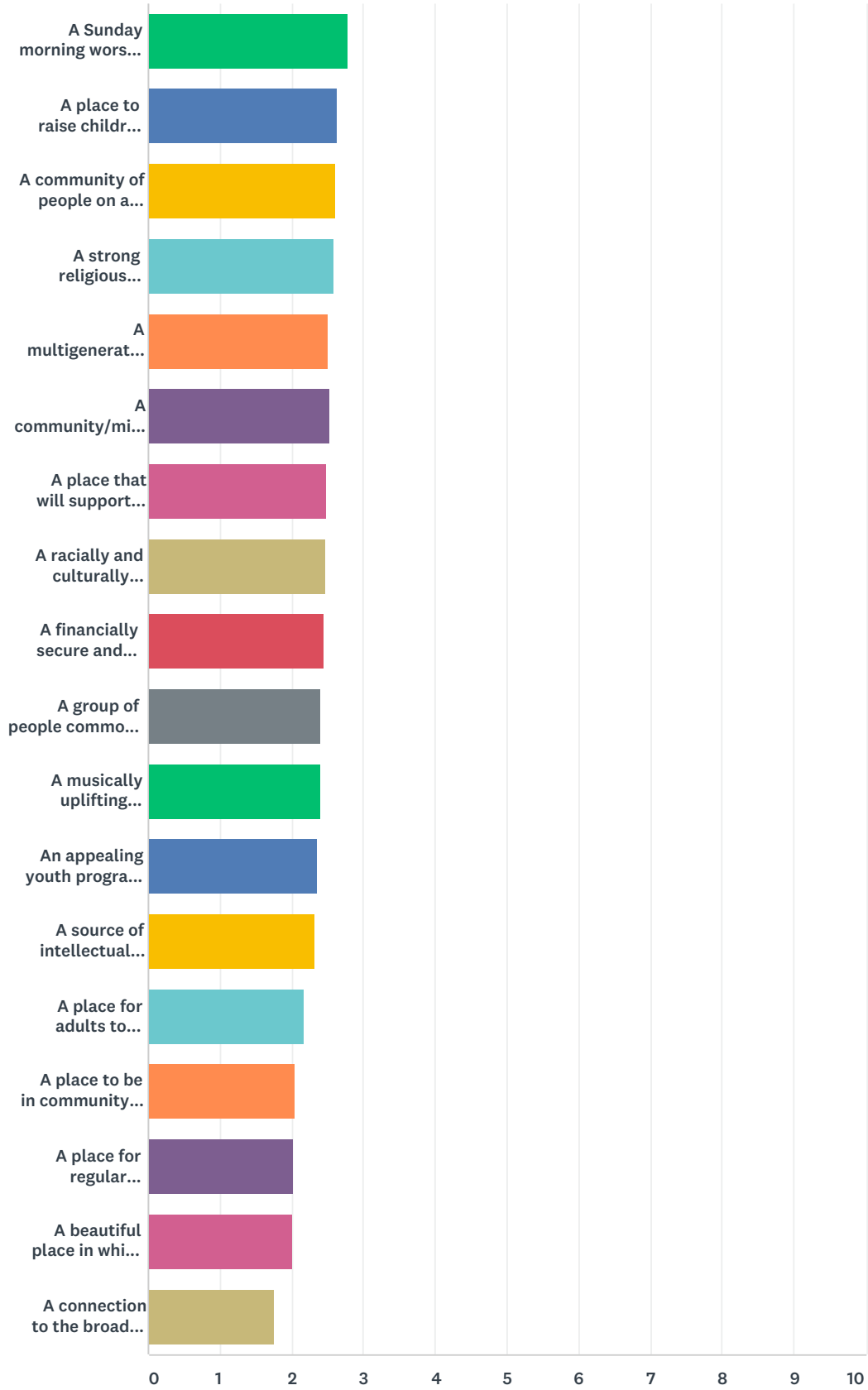

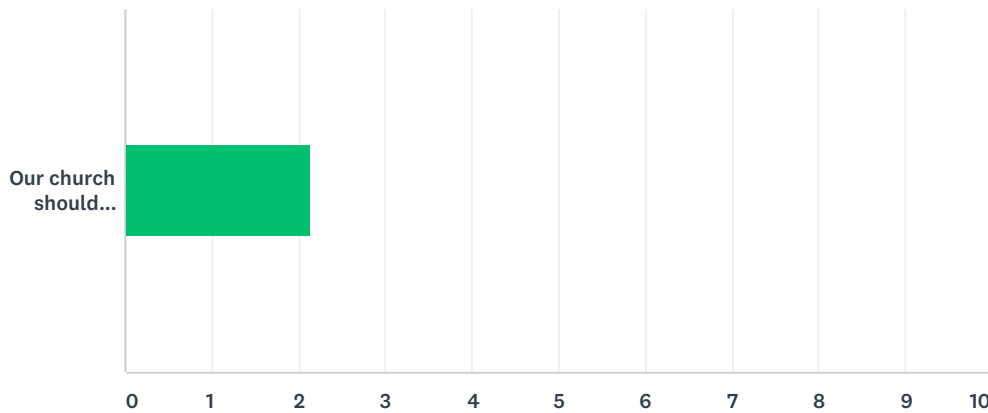

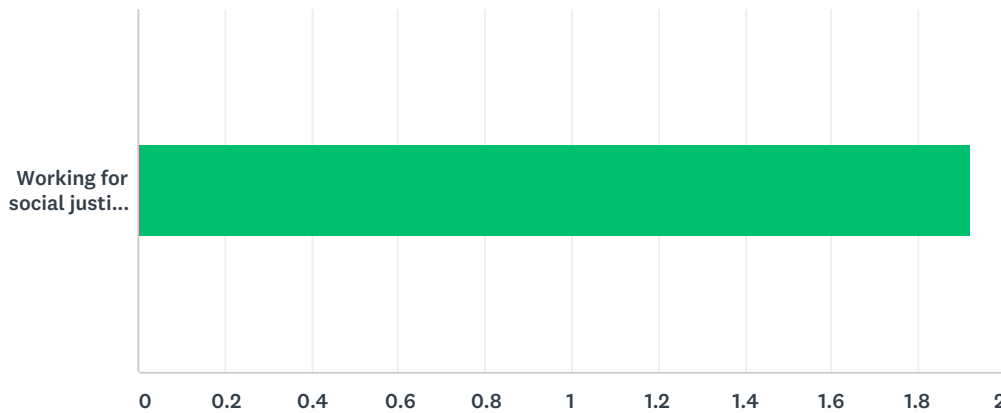

### Q11 Which of the following statements best expresses the relationship between your faith involvement and social justice work?

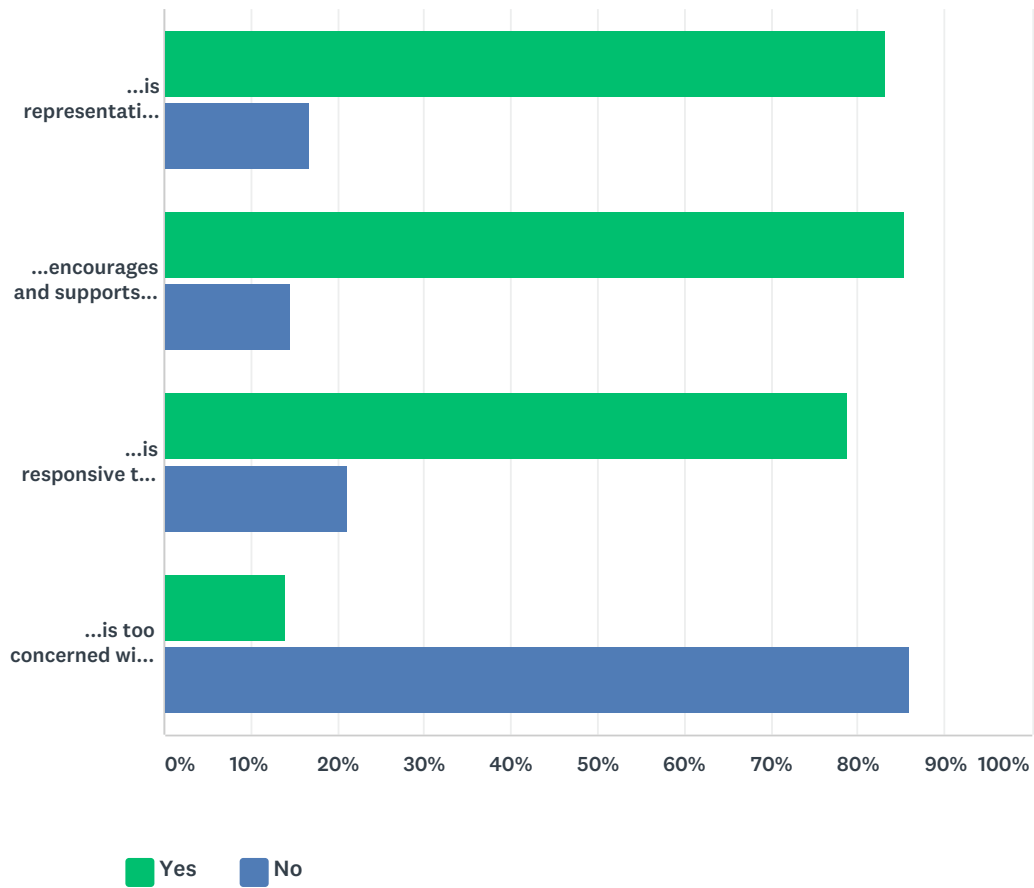

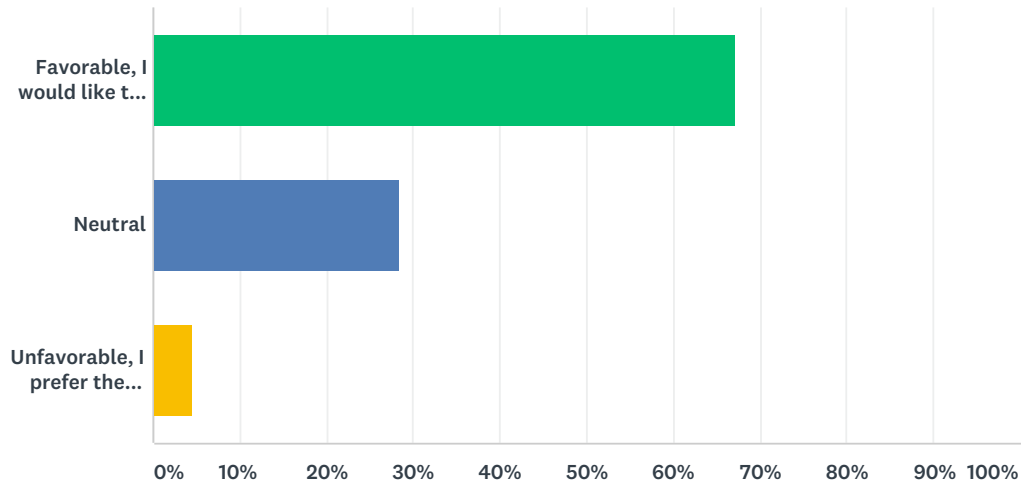

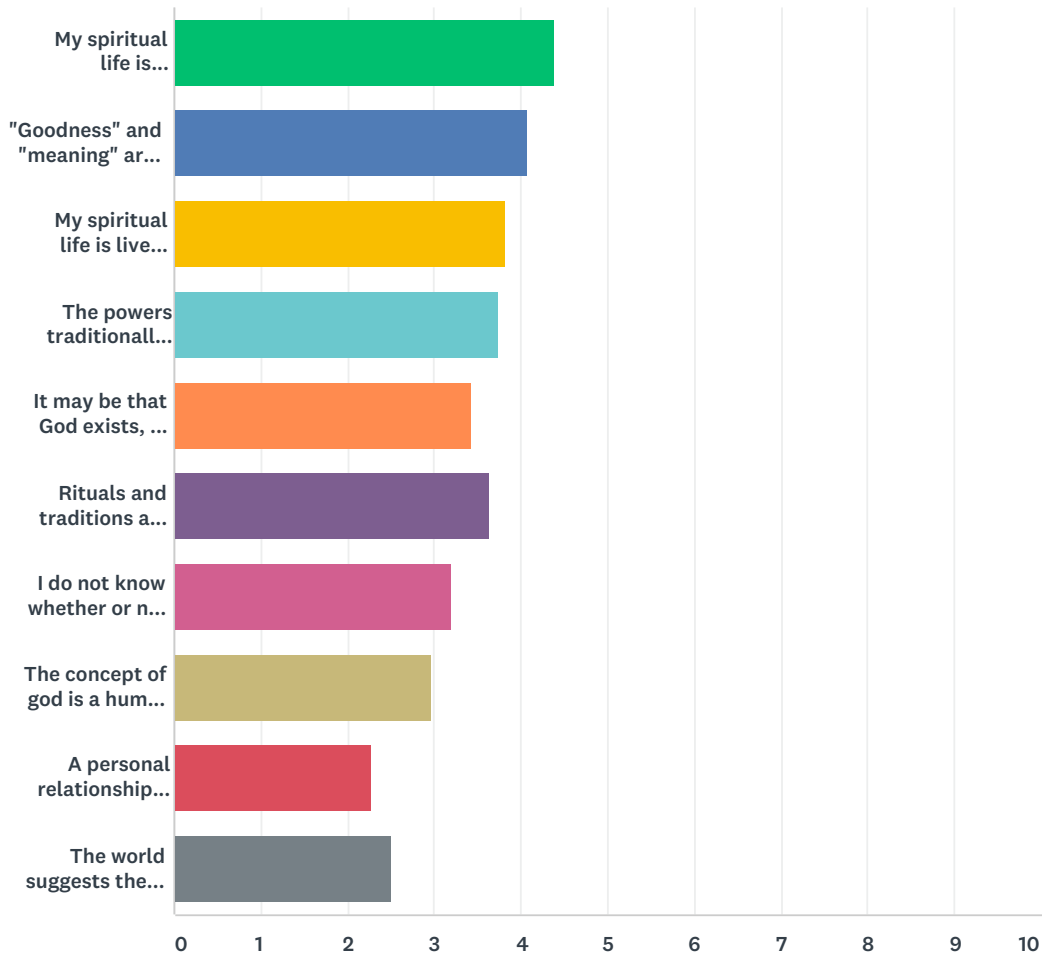

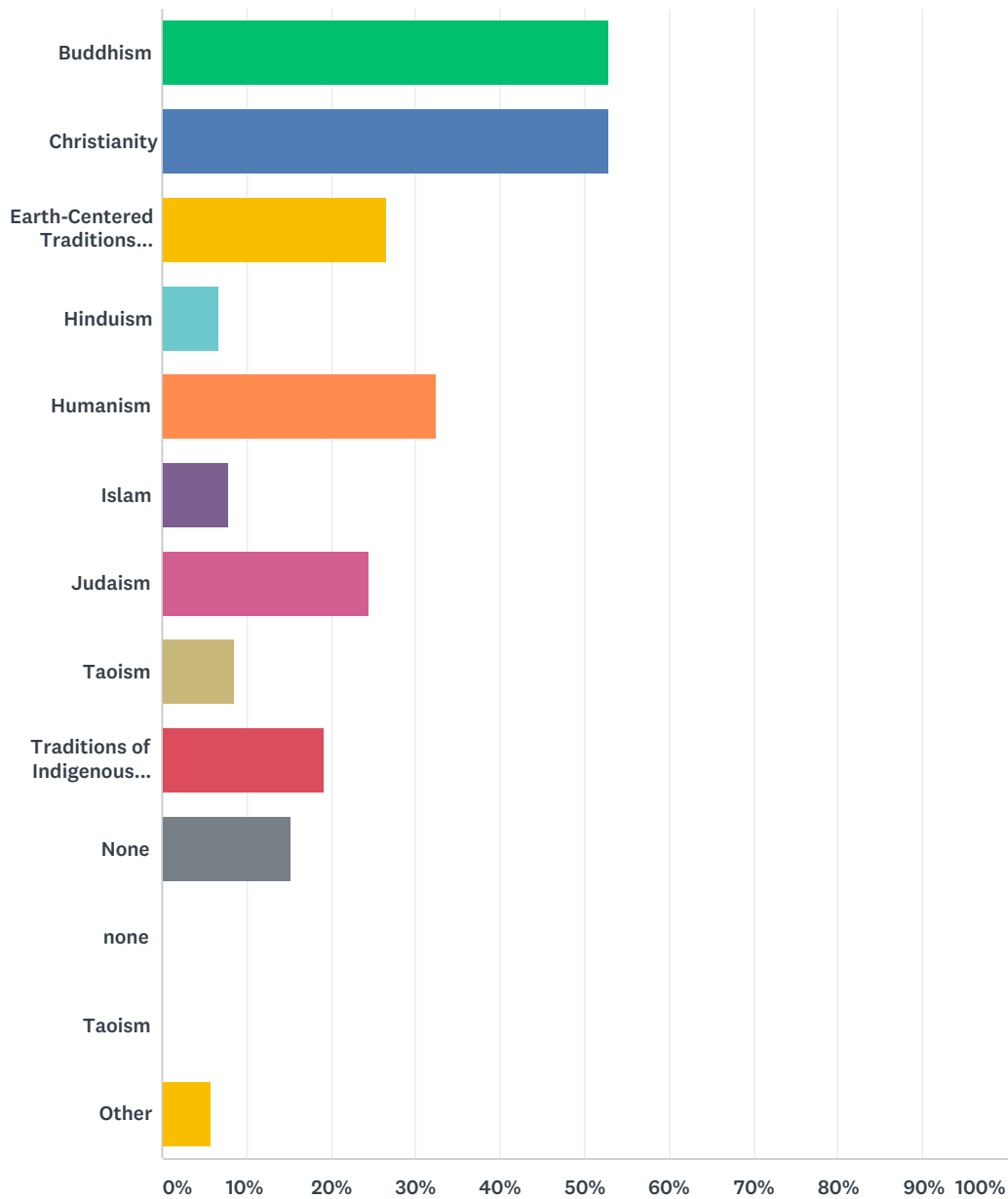

### Q17 Which most closely corresponds with your belief about immortality? (Please choose only one.)

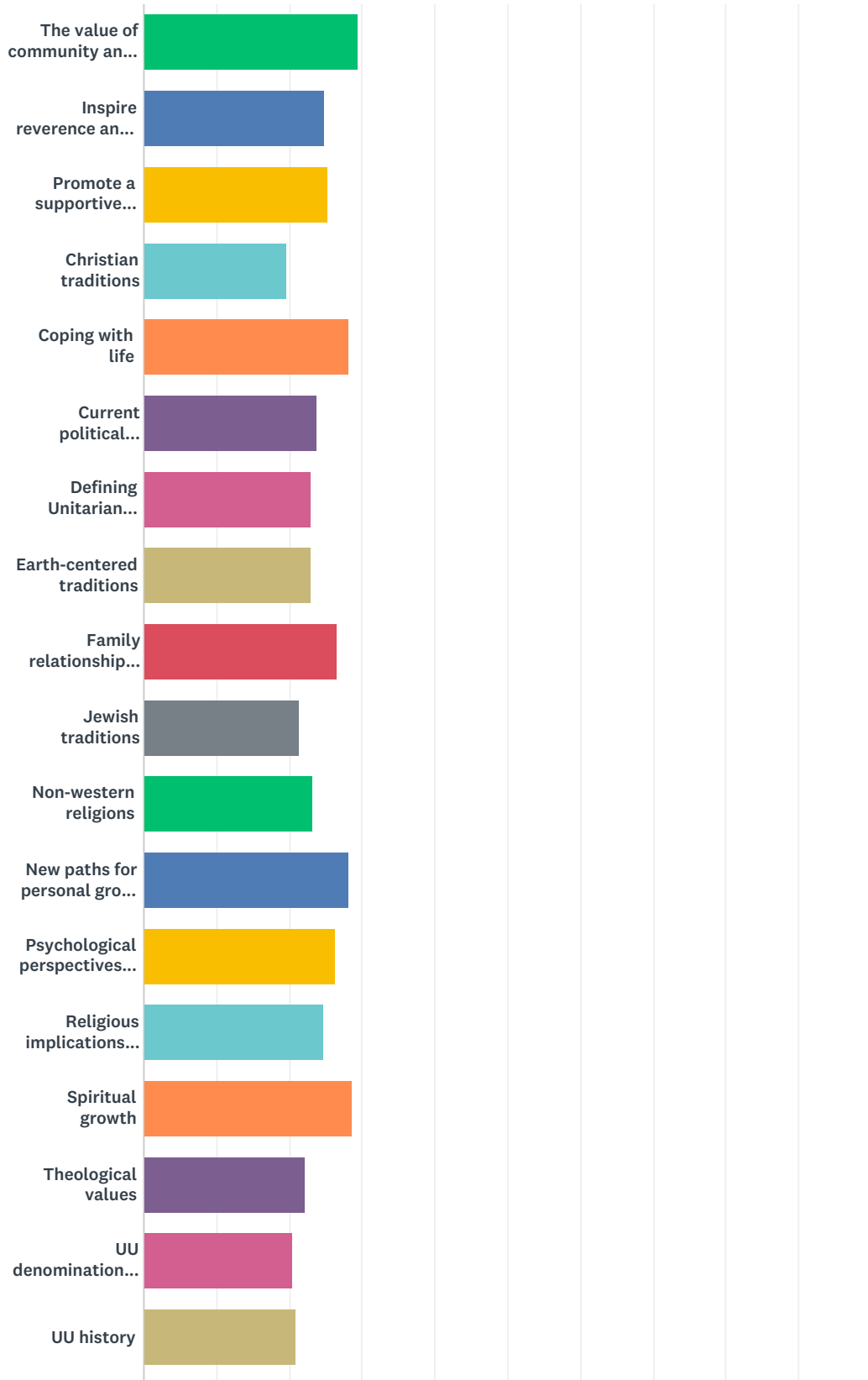

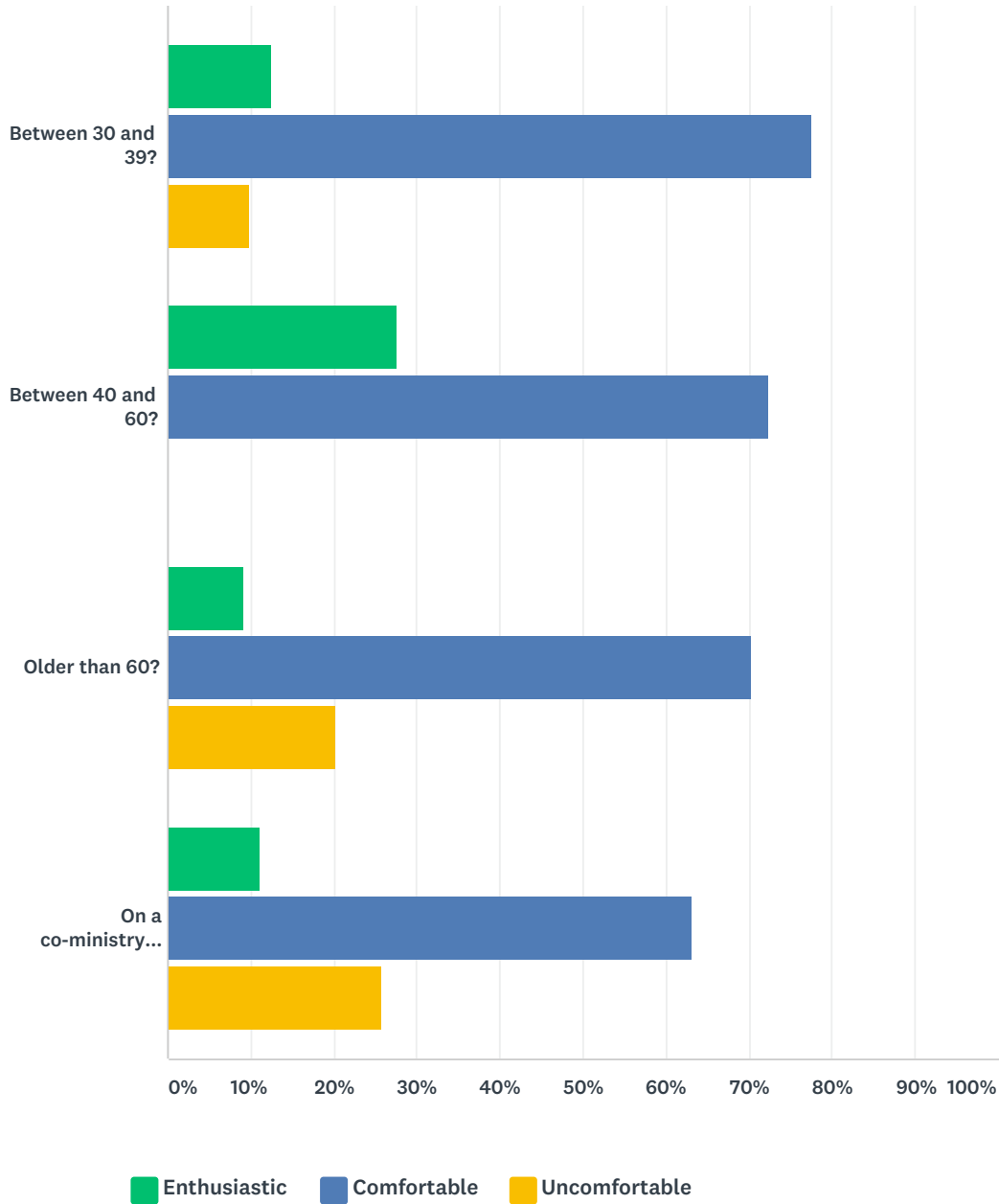


# Q21 How would you personally feel if our congregation calls a minister who is...

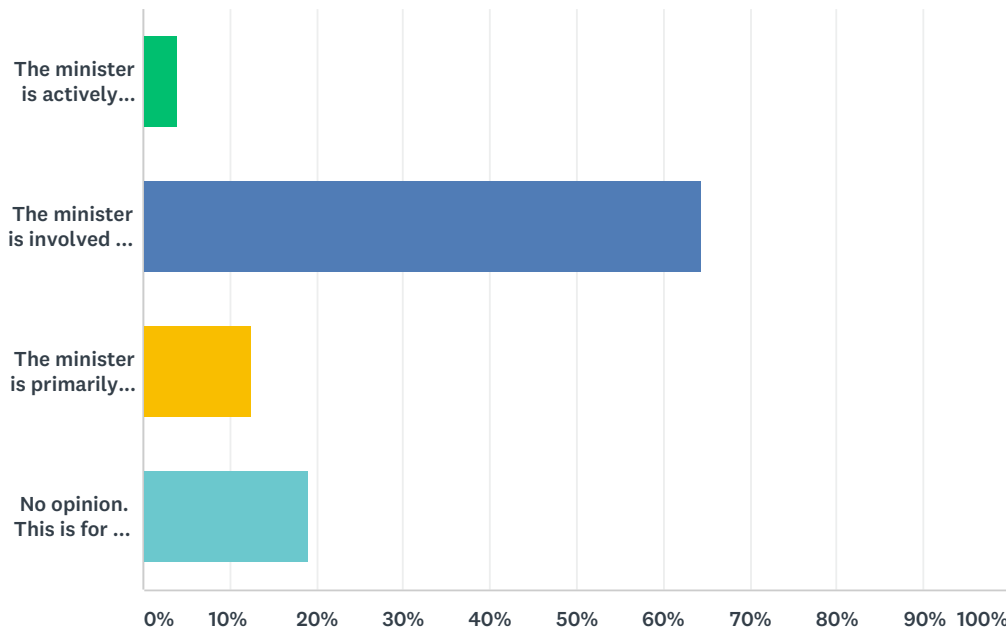

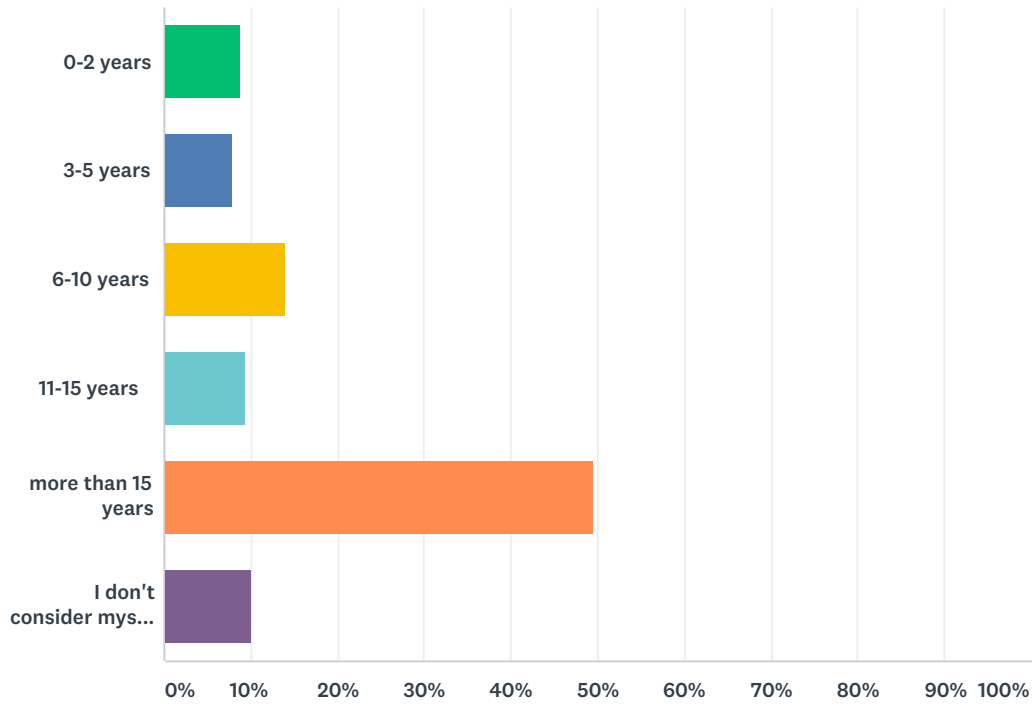

## Q27 How many years have you been a Unitarian Universalist?

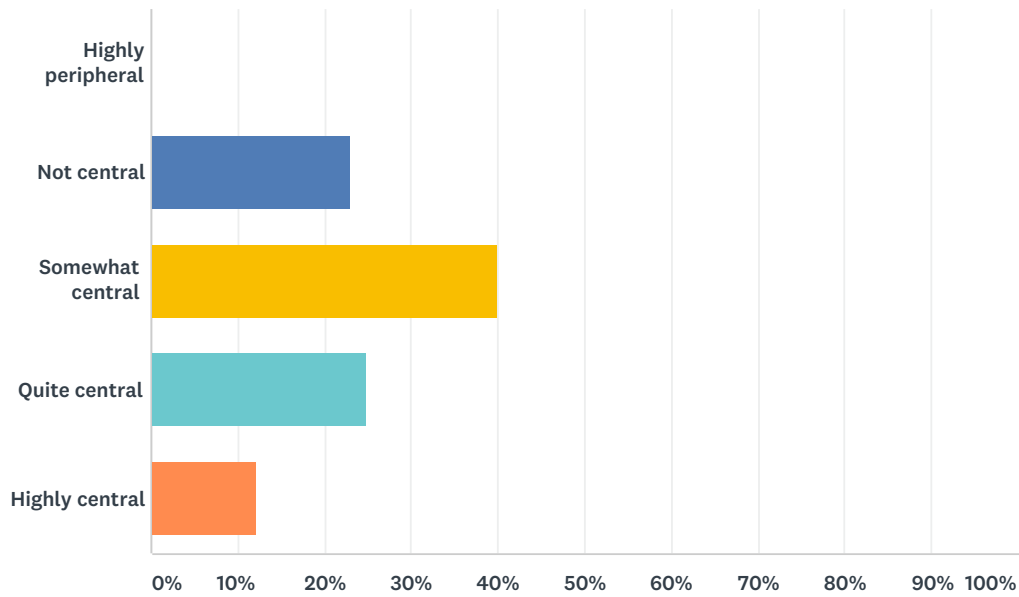

## Q28 How central is your affiliation with Unitarian Universalism to your identity as an individual?

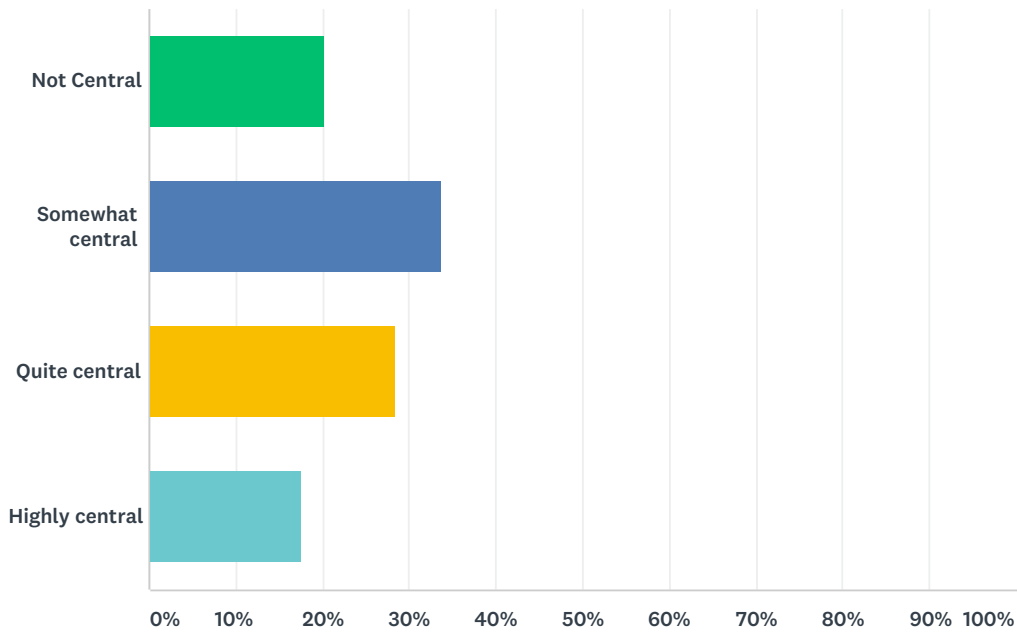

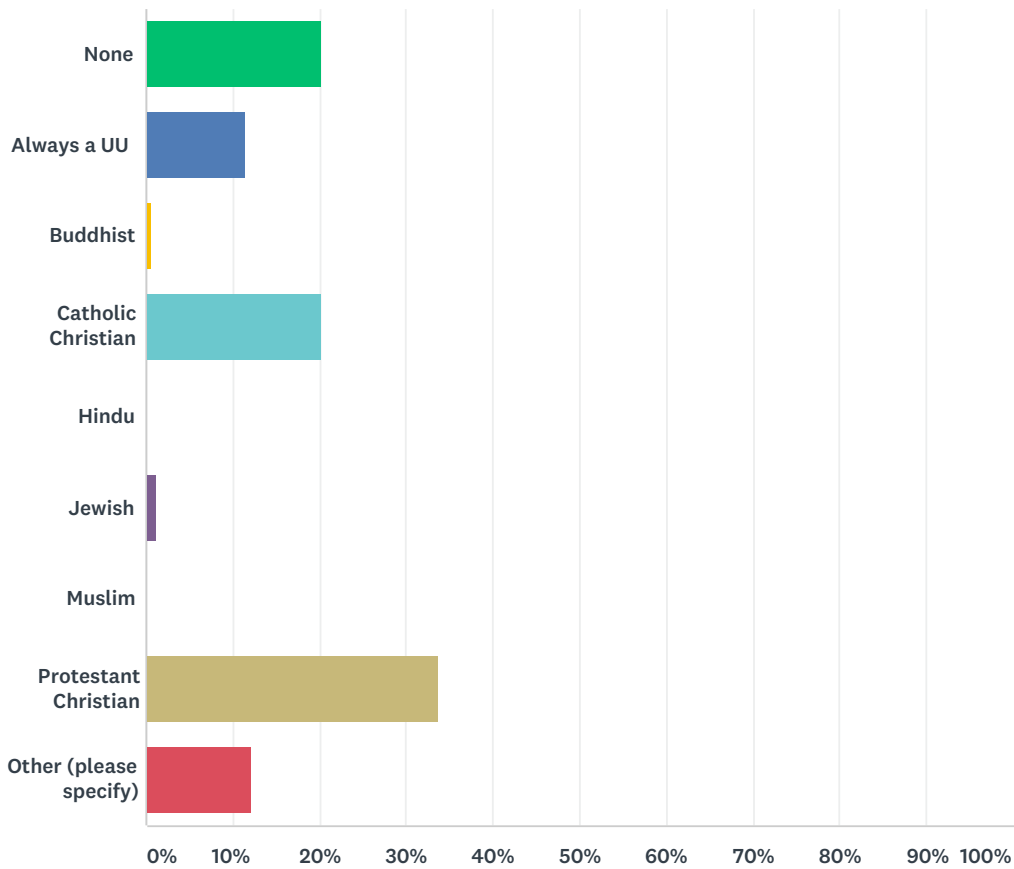

### Q30 What was your most recent prior spiritual/religious affiliation prior to Unitarian Universalism?

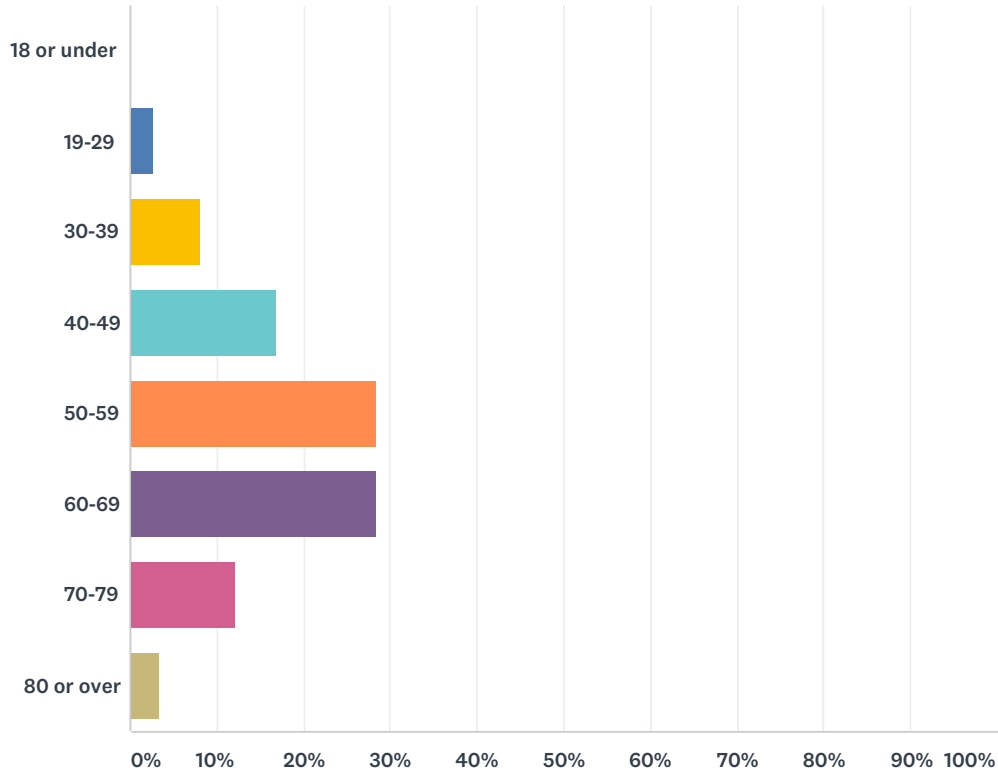

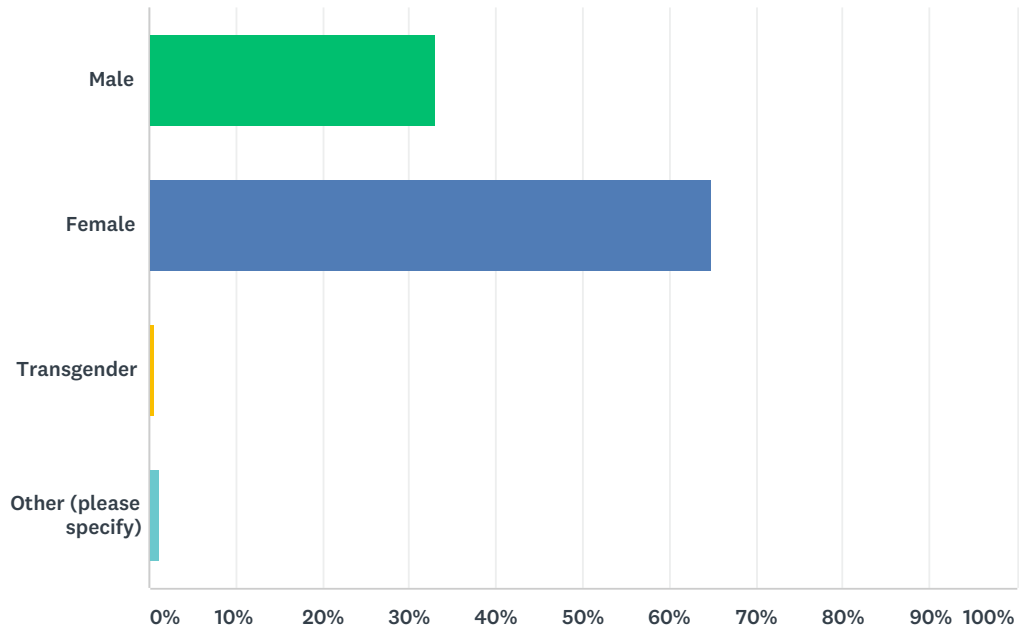

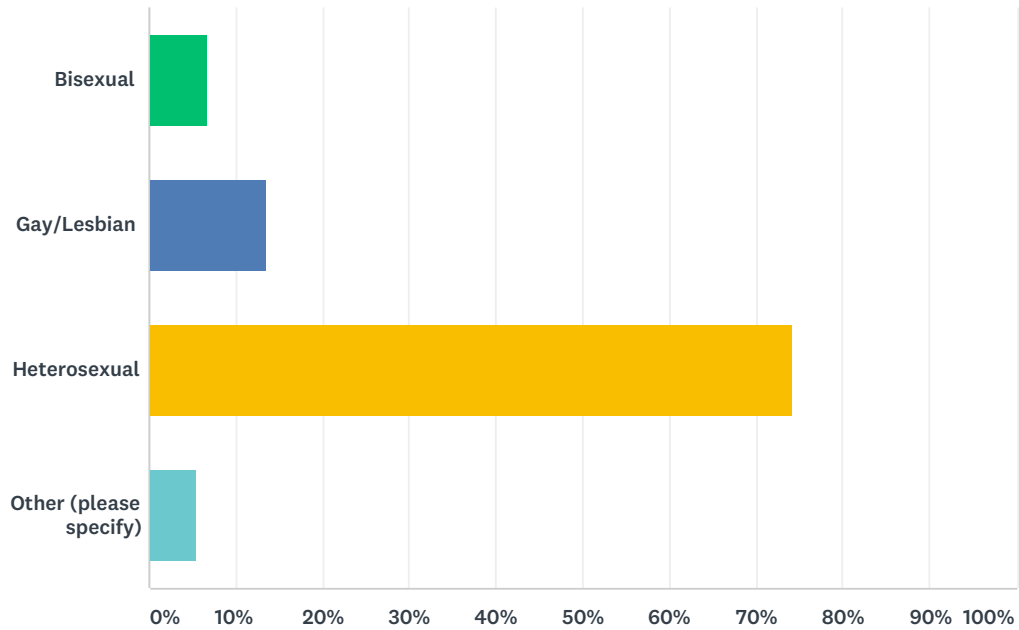

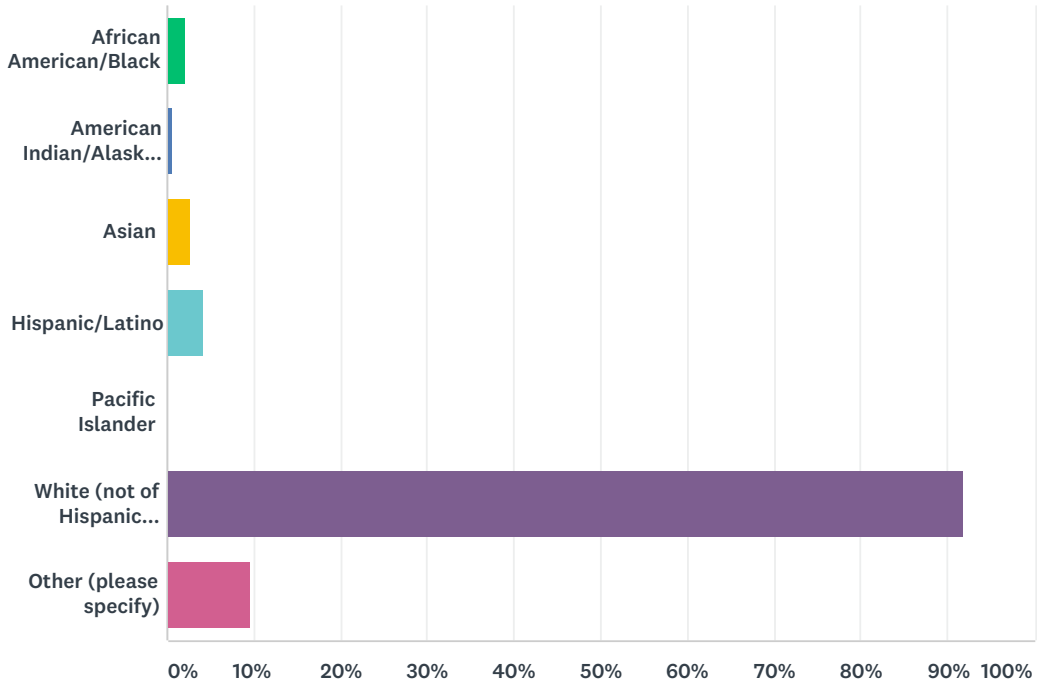

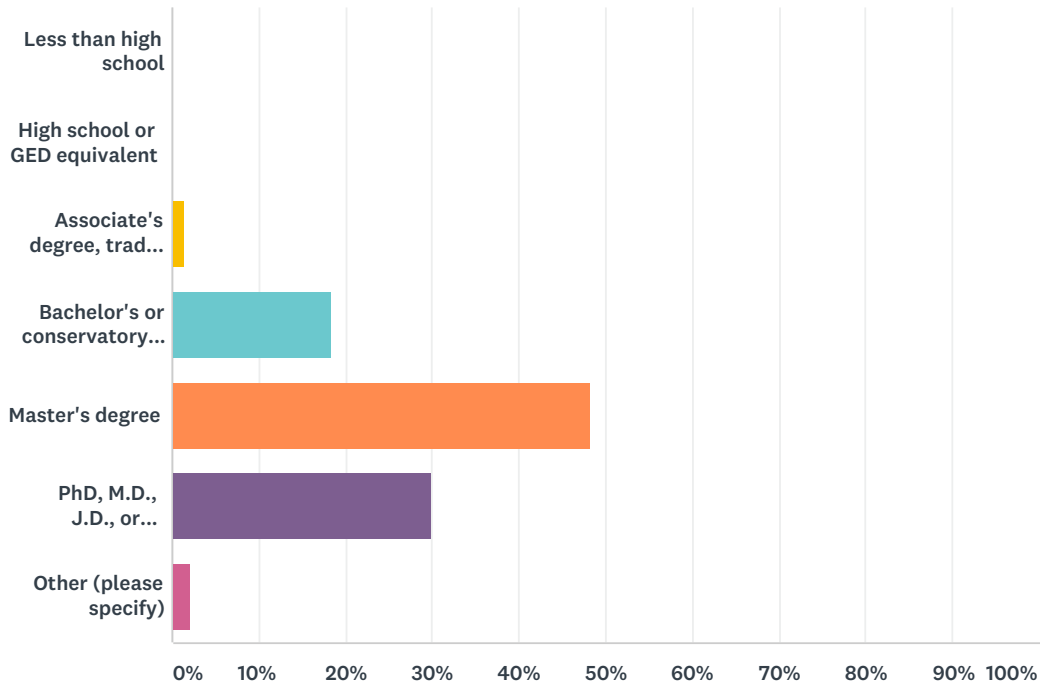

### Q35 What formal education have you completed? (Check highest level)

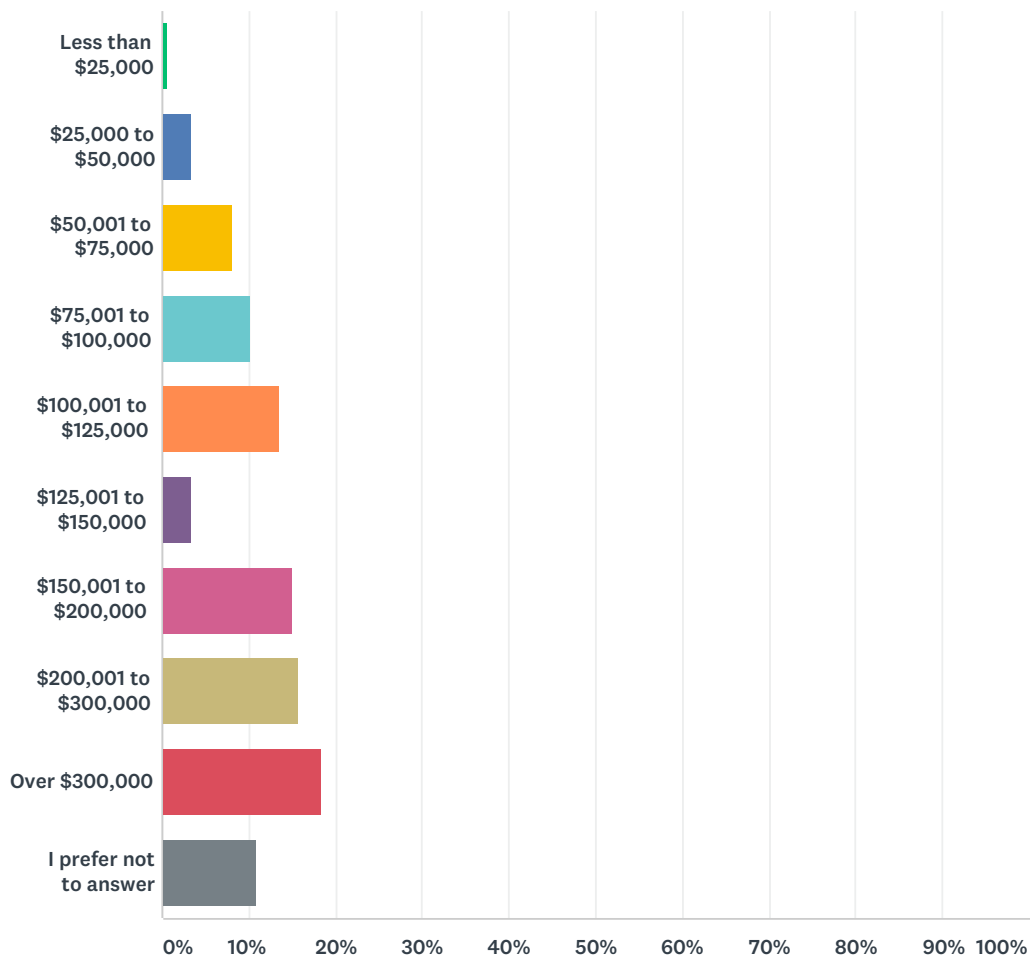

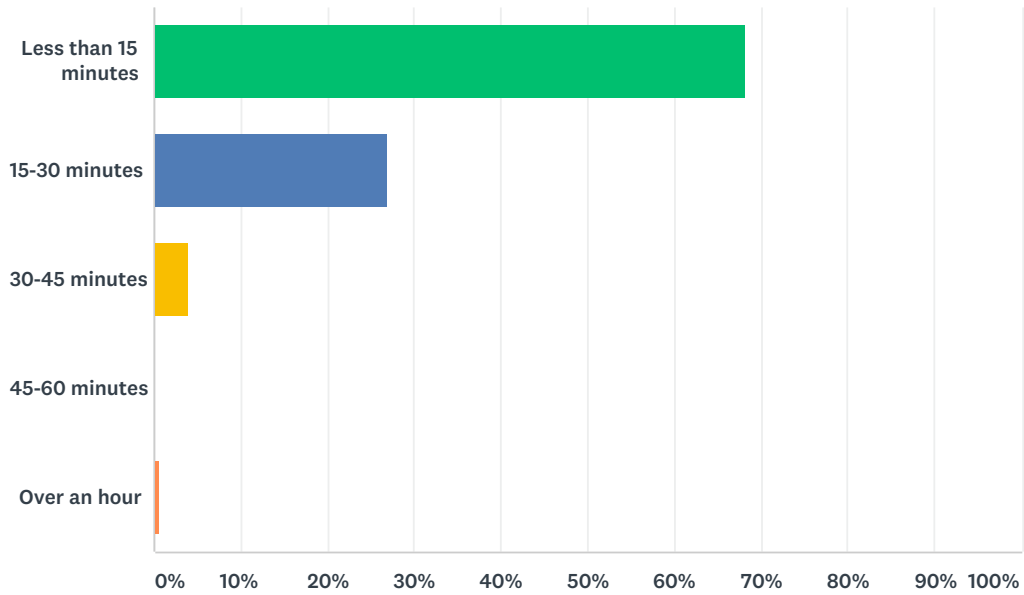
